

## **YELLOW LINES AND JUNCTION IMPROVEMENTS – TARRING**

**Dear Resident,**

Following issues raised by local residents, the **Tarring Community Forum**, “TCForum”, has been working with **WSCC** Highways to improve road safety in the ward.

Further to discussions at **TCForum**, we are pleased to place before you, proposals for the improvement of three major junctions, along with a list of locations where double yellow lines are to be installed. Drawings are not to scale and are intended to indicative of current proposals.

The images below, show what we are seeking to achieve for the safety and well-being of local residents, at each of the junctions, addressing issues of Cyclist's, Motorists, Pedestrians, Child or Adult, alike

The proposed yellow lines have been carefully sited to avoid unnecessary displacement, being almost exclusively placed at junctions **to ensure safe, clear sight-lines, in accordance with best practise and Highway Code rules.**

As with all projects of this size, we must demonstrate that there is good community engagement and support to secure funding and would ask ALL residents to demonstrate their support or otherwise for this project.

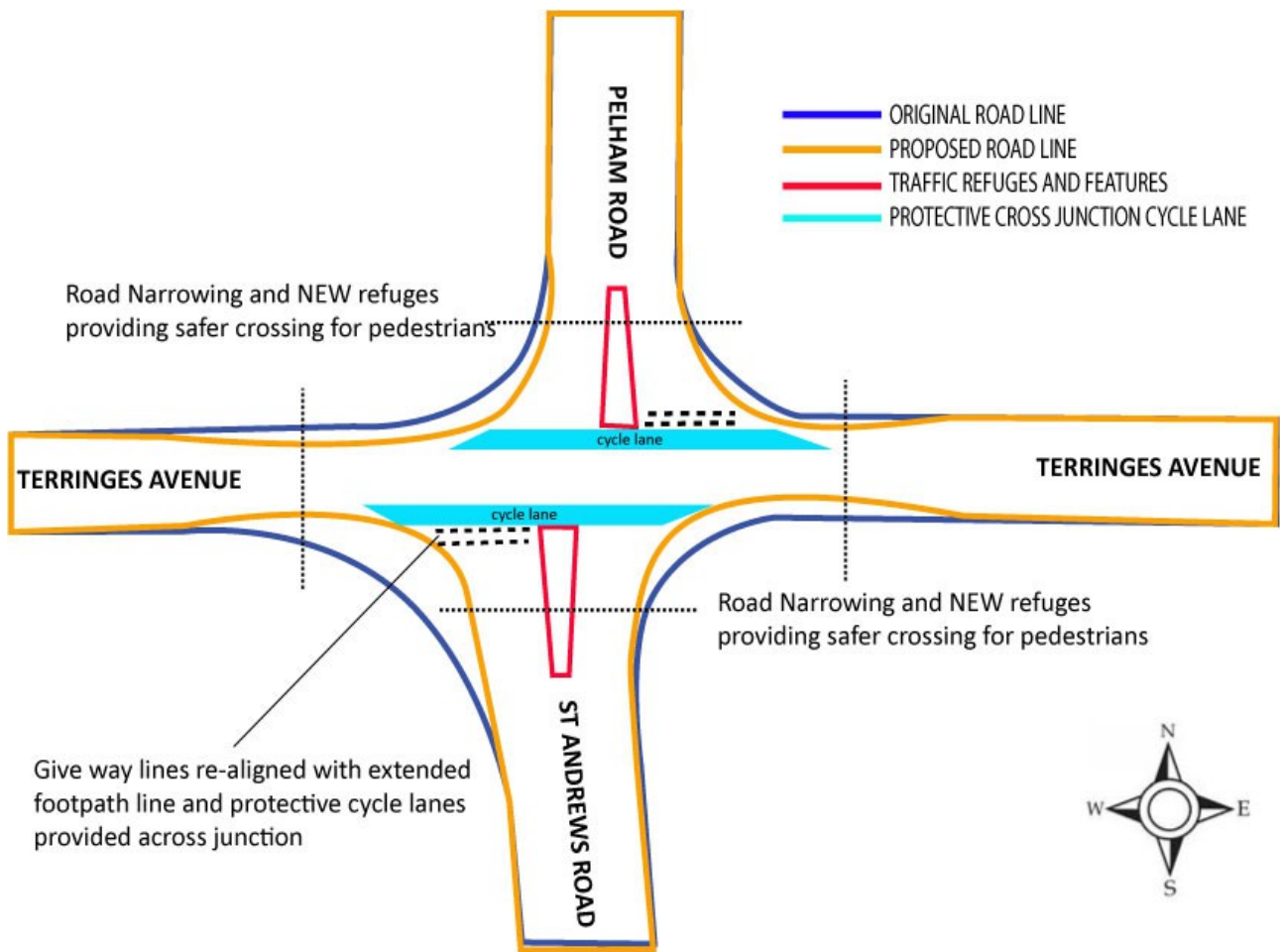

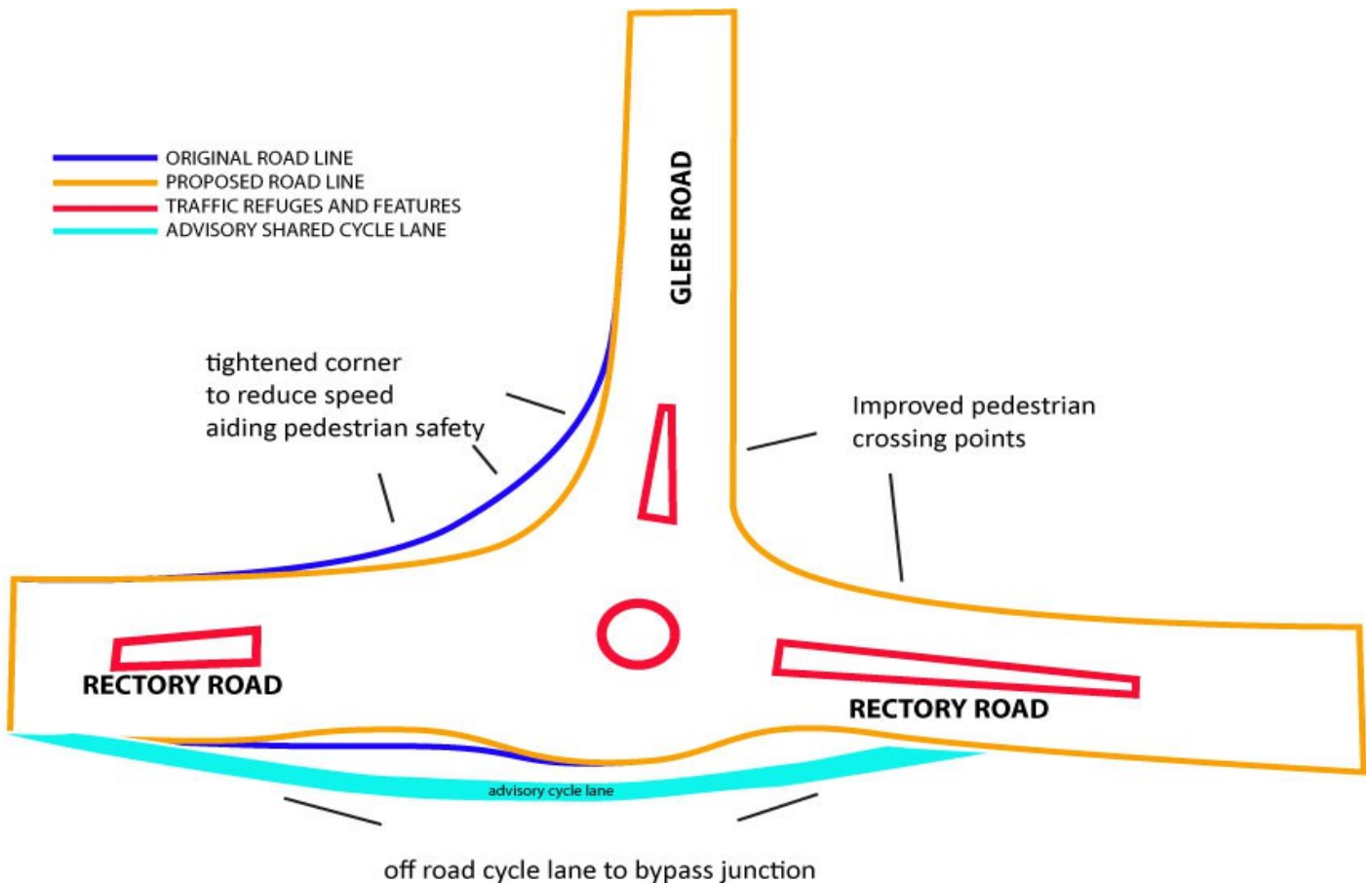

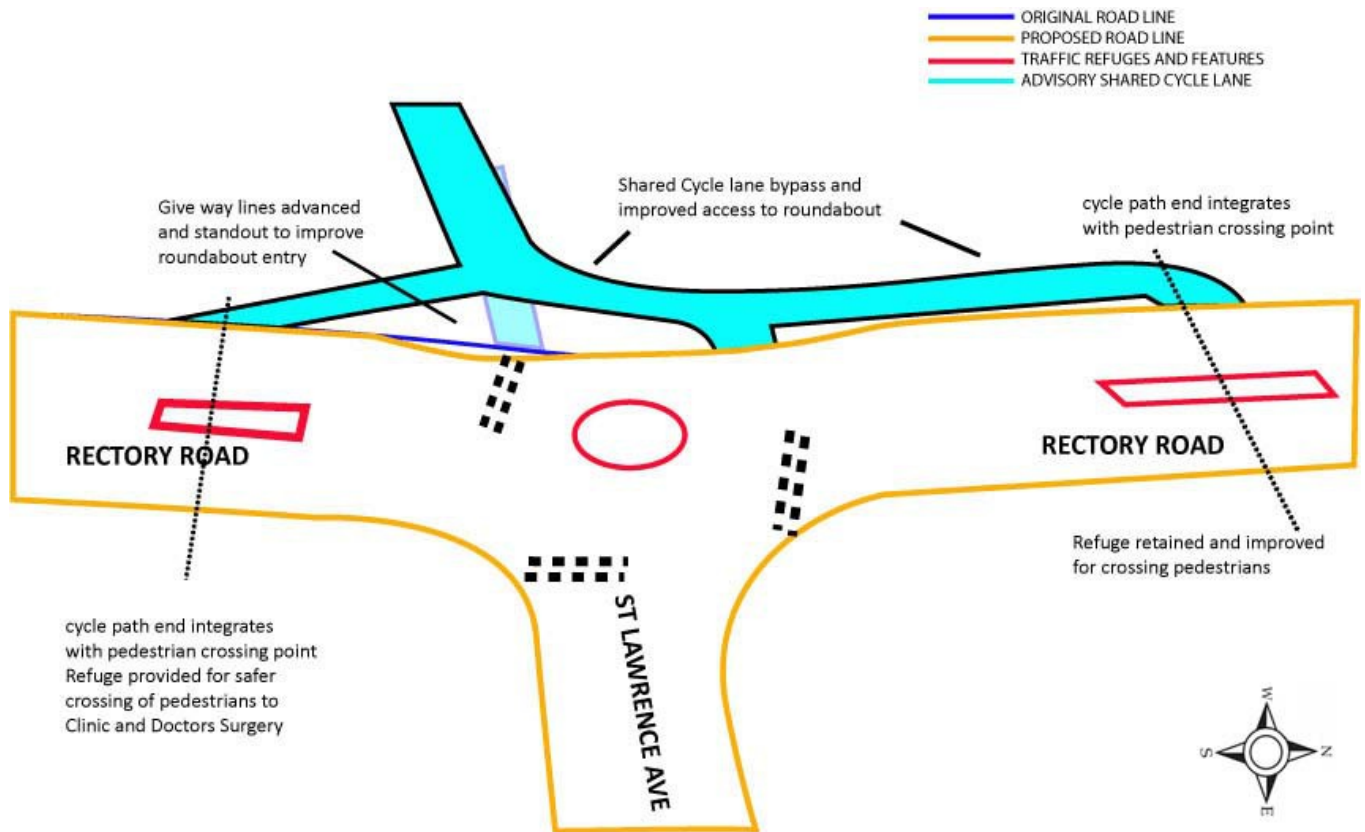
# PELHAM ROAD/ ST ANDREWS ROAD/ TERRINGES AVENUE
