## Emergency fuel

Financial support is available from Citizens Advice branches in Sussex to help vulnerable households facing a financial crisis to meet their energy costs. Emergency fuel vouchers (£28 for an individual and £49 for a family) are available to pre-payment meter customers who meet the scheme's eligibility criteria. Some clients may qualify for more than one voucher.

The scheme is funded by the County Council's not-for-profit energy supplier, Your Energy Sussex, which has increased the value of individual vouchers in response to the additional hardship faced during the Coronavirus lock down. Residents should contact their local Citizens Advice branch to check eligibility and apply.
