0176	26/05/2021 Between 02:00 Hrs & 06:00 Hrs	Maybridge Square Goring-By-Sea	Someone entered the property via an insecure rear door. Two handbags were stolen, one of which contained car keys. A vehicle was also stolen.

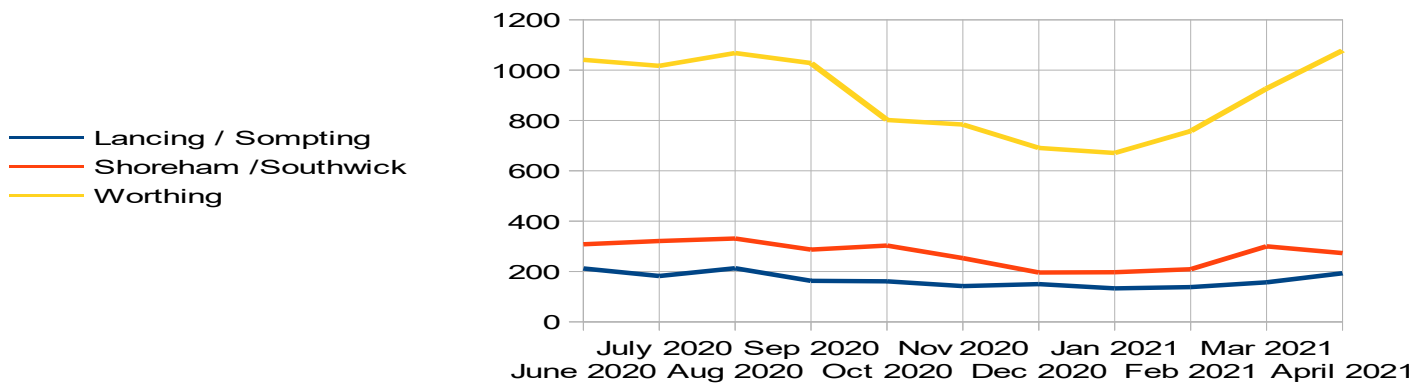
"Burglaries were looking like an "echo" of the past just a month or two ago, but a quick glance at the figures on this month's Newsletter tell a different story.
